La crise démocratique multifactorielle (montée de l'abstention, défiance à l'égard du personnel politique, polarisation des sociétés, désordres informationnels...) confronte nos sociétés au défi de la (re)construction du commun face à des espaces publics fragmentés. Pour y répondre, DemoCIS engage un collectif interdisciplinaire d'excellence issu de **4 Universités** (Lille, CY Cergy Paris Université, Jean Moulin Lyon 3, Grenoble Alpes), **3 IEP** (Lille, Grenoble, Saint-Germain-en-Laye), de **l'Institut Mines Télécom, du CNRS et d'Inria**. **336 chercheurs et enseignants-chercheurs** issus de **51 unités de recherche** dont **16 UMR CNRS et 1 Unité Propre CNRS** de disciplines SHS variées (Science politique, Sociologie, Droit, Histoire, Histoire du droit, Economie, Science de l'éducation, Géographie, Linguistique, Philologie, Philosophie, Littérature, Science de Gestion, Sciences de l'information et de la communication) sont mobilisés pour apporter des réponses à **4 défis majeurs** : 1/ Répondre à la crise des institutions par l'innovation démocratique : prise de décision, délibération et évolution des espaces publics institutionnels, 2/ Repenser les lieux et formes d'expression de la citoyenneté : citoyenneté ordinaire et nouveaux espaces de la démocratie, 3/ Agir contre la polarisation des sociétés et les désordres informationnels : information et transmissions des savoirs, 4/ Renforcer les démocraties menacées : conflits et insécurités démocratiques au prisme de l'Etat de droit.

Fort de son ancrage territorial et du large réseau national et international, académique et non-acадémique, qu'il mobilise, le consortium entend i) contribuer à la **refondation de la citoyenneté et des démocraties** en s'appuyant sur une **recherche participative** et le déploiement d'une **Convention citoyenne pour la démocratie** ii) produire des **outils pérennes** notamment un Baromètre de la démocratie axé sur les opinions et les aspirations démocratiques des citoyens ainsi qu'une plateforme dédiée à l'analyse et au suivi des risques informationnels, iii) **installer un réseau académique national et international de premier plan** sous la coordination du CNRS sur la démocratie délibérative et la confiance citoyenne.

Pour valoriser les résultats de la recherche, appuyer les politiques publiques et renforcer le lien science-société, nous créerons la **plateforme vivante pour la démocratie DemoCIS** permettant l'accès aux résultats de la recherche, aux experts du consortium par un dispositif d'interpellation citoyenne, ainsi qu'à des contenus et outils pédagogiques de formation à la citoyenneté. Nous développerons un **programme chercheur-expert**, construirons des **programmes de formation continue « sur mesure »** à l'attention des acteurs publics, déployerons des **actions de formation et de médiation grand public** en prenant appui sur les labels « Science avec et pour la société » de nos établissements.

DemoCIS est au cœur des priorités scientifiques du consortium, et de l'Université de Lille en particulier, qui fait du soutien aux SHS, inscrit dans son COMP, un point central de sa stratégie scientifique. La thématique de l'**Evolution des Démocraties**, notamment développée au sein d'un Cluster dédié du **Hub Cultures, sociétés et pratiques en mutation (I-SITE Lille)** créé en 2020, occupe déjà une place majeure dans sa production scientifique en SHS (10% sur la période 2019-2024) que DemoCIS a vocation à amplifier. DemoCIS prendra appui sur des dispositifs nationaux, notamment le **GIS Démocratie et Participation** au sein duquel les partenaires jouent d'ores et déjà un rôle leader, ainsi que sur les synergies déjà existantes entre membres du consortium et les nombreuses parties prenantes nationales et internationales réunies autour du projet, pour installer une communauté scientifique interdisciplinaire d'excellence sur l'**Evolution des Démocraties**.



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The multifactorial democratic crisis (rising abstention rates, mistrust of politicians, polarization of societies, informational disorder, etc.) confronts our societies with the challenge of (re)constructing the commons in the context of fragmented public spaces. To meet this challenge, DemoCIS has brought together an interdisciplinary group of excellence from **4 universities** (Lille, CY Cergy Paris Université, Jean Moulin Lyon 3, Grenoble Alpes), **3 IEP** (Lille, Grenoble, Saint-Germain-en-Laye), **Institut Mines Télécom, CNRS and Inria**. DemoCIS involves a total of **336 researchers and teacher-researchers** from **51 research units**, including **16 CNRS UMRs and 1 CNRS Unit**, and a wide range of HSS disciplines (Political Science, Sociology, Law, History, History of Law, Economics, Educational Science, Geography, Linguistics, Philology, Philosophy, Literature, Management Science, Information and Communications Science) are mobilized to provide responses to **4 major challenges**: 1/ Responding to the institutional crisis through democratic innovation: decision making, deliberation and the evolution of institutional public spaces; 2/ Rethinking the places and forms of expression of citizenship: everyday citizenship and new spaces of democracy; 3/ Acting against the polarization of societies and informational disorder: information and the transmission of knowledge; 4/ Strengthening threatened democracies: democratic conflicts and insecurities through the prism of the rule of law.

Drawing on local roots and an extensive national and international academic and non-academic network, the consortium intends to i) contribute to the **rebuilding of citizenship and democracies through participatory research** and the deployment of a **Citizens' Convention for Democracy**; ii) **produce sustainable tools**, notably a Democracy Barometer focusing on citizens' opinions and democratic aspirations, and a platform dedicated to analyzing and monitoring informational risks; iii) **set up a leading national and international academic network** on deliberative democracy and citizen trust, coordinated by the CNRS.

To enhance the value of the research results, support public policy and strengthen the science-society link, we will create a living platform for DemoCIS democracy, providing access to research results, to the consortium's experts via a citizen query system and to educational content and tools for citizenship training. We will develop a researcher-expert program, build tailor-made continuing education programs for public-sector players, and roll out training and mediation initiatives for the general public, drawing on our establishments' "Science with and for society" labels.

DemoCIS is at the heart of the scientific priorities of the consortium, and of the University of Lille in particular, which has made support for the social sciences and humanities a central part of its scientific strategy. The "Democracies in Evolution" theme, notably developed within a dedicated Cluster of the **Changing Cultures, Societies and Practices Hub (I-SITE Lille)** created in 2020, already occupies a major place in ULille's scientific production in HSS (10% during the 2019-2024 period), which DemoCIS aims to amplify. DemoCIS will draw on national mechanisms, in particular the GIS Démocratie et Participation in which the partners already play a leading role, as well as existing synergies between consortium members and the many national and international stakeholders brought together for the project, to establish an interdisciplinary scientific community of excellence on the Evolution of Democracies.



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## 1. Ambition

### 1.1. Theme, scientific challenges, societal ambitions

Democracies are weakened by multiple threats (polarization of societies, fake news, cyber-attacks, political violence...), to the point that some fear they may disappear. Growing disaffection with representative processes could turn citizens away from the desire to live in a democracy. In the face of the decisive issues raised by this democratic crisis, the Human and Social Sciences (HSS) have so far offered contradictory results, which suffer from disciplinary and epistemological fragmentation. DemoCIS, by bringing together a diverse and complementary consortium, mobilizing a broad disciplinary spectrum, will not only seek to better describe the democratic crisis, but, above all, it will aim to inform public policies and civil society with co-produced knowledge. **Drawing on our unique expertise in participatory research and on the substantial knowledge that will be produced, our ambition is to work with institutions, citizens and civil society to experiment with alternative democratic practices, within institutional and non-institutionalized spaces, which can feed into public policy actions and reassert citizens' place.** More specifically, DemoCIS has four key objectives:

1. **Contribute to the rebuilding of citizenship and democracies through participatory research and the implementation of a Citizens' Convention for Democracy**, developed in collaboration with stakeholders from civil society and partners with methodological expertise in this field (Stanford University, Université Grenoble Alpes, Université de Nantes). Its purpose is to capture people's democratic aspirations and nourish proposals for institutional reform based on citizens' deliberations.
2. **Develop sustainable tools** for the academic community, decision-makers, and society:
  - A **Democracy Barometer** focusing on opinions and democratic aspirations and an **International Observatory of Democratic Practices**, focusing on past and present experiments. Both will feed into the first stages of the creation of an **Institut Universitaire d'Analyse de l'Opinion Publique (IUOP)**, **focusing on Deliberative Democracy and Citizen Trust**, which could be enacted in the GIS Démocratie et participation. DemoCIS's ambition is to provide France with a public academic institute that will produce itself its data, stemming from public research, independent of private polling institutes, such as ANES (American National Election Studies).
  - A **platform dedicated to observing, analyzing and monitoring systemic risks in the French information landscape**, and assessing their impact on public opinion.
  - Experimentation in certain areas (Lille, Grenoble, Lyon, Ile-de-France, etc.) with **democratic mediation mechanisms** to regulate and manage local conflicts, involving the Commission nationale du débat public (National Commission for Public Debate).
3. **Construct a first-rate national and international academic network, mobilizing and bringing together, in addition to the DemoCIS partners, the numerous national and international stakeholders.** This dynamic will enable our consortium to apply to international research projects, and the program includes actions and resources to encourage the submission of European projects.
4. **Create training materials and tools for the public** (such as the Fresque de la désinformation) to enhance citizens' capacity to engage in democratic processes and encourage citizen participation and develop **training resources for elected representatives and decision-makers**.

### 1.2. Lead institution, consortium, stakeholders

**The University of Lille.** The University of Lille is the DemoCIS project leader. Awarded with the I-SITE label of excellence in 2017, it comprises 11 faculties and institutes (including 7 in the Human



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and Social Sciences (HSS)) and 4 member schools (including Science Po Lille and the Ecole supérieure de journalisme de Lille) and is one of the largest universities in the French-speaking world, with almost 80,000 students (including 10,000 international students), 64 research units and 3,300 teacher-researchers and researchers. The University of Lille has made support for the HSS a central part of its scientific strategy. Relying on 20 HSS units, including 8 CNRS UMRs, the creation of the **Hub Cultures, sociétés et pratiques en mutation (Changing cultures, societies and practices)** in 2020 was strongly supported by the I-SITE and has made it possible to initiate and structure interdisciplinary research dynamics on democracies via a dedicated cluster. Furthermore, the goal of "making the HSS an element of the University of Lille's transversal identity" is enshrined in its Contract of Objectives, Means and Performance (COMP). **The theme of the Evolution of Democracies already occupies a significant place in the institution's HSS scientific output** (777 publications over the 2019-2024 period, i.e. 10% of the institution's HSS output). The University of Lille **has committed 159 teacher-researchers to DemoCIS, 64 of whom will be spending more than 50% of their research time on the project.** DemoCIS will mobilize the expertise developed thanks to **6 fundamental chairs at the Institut Universitaire de France (IUF)** on democratic issues, a **Jean Monnet Chair** in European Law on state, citizen and regional implications in the European Union, and a **Parliamentary Studies Chair**, created as part of the University of Lille's support for sustainable development goals, including Goal 16 - Peace, justice and effective institutions. Part of this dynamic includes a **cross-disciplinary project** supported by the I-SITE Excellence Initiative, involving 46 researchers and teacher-researchers (economists, political scientists, psychologists, lawyers, historians and computer scientists) on "Decision-making under radical uncertainty". The University of Lille is a **leader in the field of participatory research**, as demonstrated by its leadership of the GIS Démocratie et Participation, its involvement at the heart of the collaborative project "Croiser les Savoirs avec tou.te.s" with ATD Quart Monde, and its participation in the French component of the International Social Survey Program (ISSP). It is also a lead of the Observatoire Linguistique du Discours Numérique (awarded the Initiative d'Intérêt Culturel et Scientifique label) and has developed internationally recognized expertise in the study of cybersecurity, breaches of the rule of law and associative freedoms through the research units CERAPS, CRDP and Clersé. The DemoCIS project is designed to amplify this trajectory.

**The consortium.** The University of Lille is the leader of the DemoCIS project, which brings together the Université Jean Moulin Lyon 3, the Université Grenoble Alpes, CY Cergy Paris Université, IEP Grenoble, IEP Saint-Germain-en-Laye, Institut Mines Télécom, CNRS and Inria. DemoCIS represents a consortium of **336 teacher-researchers and researchers**, of which **105** will be dedicating over 50% of their research time to the project. They belong to **51 research units**, including **16 CNRS UMRs** (CERAPS - CHJ - CLERSE - HALMA - IRHIS - LEM - STL - IRHIM - LARHA - TRIANGLE - CESDIP - THEMA - IRISA - LAB-STIC - LPNC - PACTE) and **1 CNRS Unit**. The members of the consortium bring a diverse range of expertise from various Human and Social Sciences disciplines, including **Political Science, Law, History of Law, Education Science, Sociology, Geography, History, Economics, Linguistics, Philology, Philosophy, Literature, Management, Information and Communication Sciences**. Their production represents more than **1950 publications since 2019** on the DemoCIS theme. Together, they are involved in **22 ANR projects, 6 European projects in the field and 9 fundamental chairs at the Institut Universitaire de France**. The members of the consortium participate in a number of important scientific interest groups and networks (GIS Eurolab, GIS Marsouin, Groupement européen de recherche sur les normativités, the European Association of Research and Technology Organisations, the European Digital Media Observatory, the Media Pluralism Monitor, etc.) and play key roles in national and international bodies (World Electoral



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Justice Network, Association française de Droit Constitutionnel, Assises de la francophonie scientifique on disinformation and its link with scientific diplomacy, etc.).

**The partners.** The **CNRS**, as host of the Humanum and Progedo infrastructures, will provide major support in the management and valorization of the project's data and research. A variety of CNRS components, including CNRS international networks, CNRS research units abroad (Maison Française d'Oxford, Centre Marc Bloch, Centre français de recherche en sciences sociales de Prague, etc.), thematic networks (e.g. RT Internet IA et société), GISs (GIS Démocratie et participation, GIS Euro-Lab,), International Research Networks (IRN *Les défis d'une participation accrue des citoyens au fonctionnement des institutions : entre développement d'une culture participative et démocratisation des démocraties*, IRN *Démocratie et libertés à l'ère numérique : vers la e-démocratie de droit (e-delib)*) ,will be major support points for the establishment of an unprecedented international research network to support DemoCIS. **Inria**, co-leader of the eENSEMBLE PEPR, will bring to the project its expertise in digital collaboration and digital uses, as well as in the development of digital tools. It will collaborate on the processing of the *Citizens' Convention for Democracy* through topic modelling (such as that developed as part of the automatic analysis of open consultations during the *Grand Débat National*) and will accompany the project on the data visualization of quantitative and qualitative data from the Democracy Barometer. **The University of Lyon 3** has 2 Chairs at the Institut Universitaire de France in the field. It is also a member of the Labex Comod (Constitution de la Modernité: Raison, Religion, Politique, axis 3 "L'Etat et les citoyens") and is home to the Jean Monnet ProValUE Chair for "promoting and preserving the values of the European Union". Université Lyon 3, which hosts the Franco-Quebec Chair in Freedom of Expression, is today the leading institution for the study of threats to freedom of expression, at the crossroads of philosophy, law and history. **Université Grenoble Alpes** has expertise in high-profile longitudinal systems, such as the *Observatoire des non-recours aux droits et aux services* (Odenore), for the analysis and improvement of public policies, and in data and analytical tools to improve understanding of exposure to information on social networks. Through its UNESCO Chair in International Communication, this partner engages in scientific and educational activities focused on building inclusive societies and promoting freedom of expression while combating discrimination and hate speech. **Sciences Po Grenoble** has one fundamental Chair at the Institut Universitaire de France. Together with UGA, is involved in several international surveys (*European Values Study, International Social Survey Program*) and French election studies (FES) in collaboration with PROGEDO IR\*'s. Through the research lab PACTE, they also have teams studying transformations in justice, the relations between police and populations, as well as on cyber issues, with Cyberalps (Grenoble Cybersecurity Institute), and the MIAI Chair (and its Legal and regulatory implications of artificial intelligence chair). **CY Cergy Paris Université** and **Sciences Po Saint-Germain-en-Laye** have recognized expertise in political violence and (de)radicalization and radical right-wing groups (Junior Chair HSS 2023 "Opposition strategies to European illiberal forces, on the analysis of public policies developed in response to these threats, on penal institutions and relations between police and society"). The Cesdip research unit at CYU leads the *Groupe européen de recherches sur les normativités* (GERN) and has built a long-term partnership with the *Centre International de Criminologie Comparée* at the Université de Montréal. **Institut Mines Télécom** is currently engaged in an ANR project and two European projects, including ENFIELD and MeDeMap, directly linked to the DemoCIS program. These projects along with the creation and Chair of the *Good in Tech* research network and participation in the *Advisory board of Princeton University accelerator to study information environment*, as well as collaboration with EDMO and MPM networks, provide essential data, analysis grids and a rich network of collaborators. Several IMT teacher-researchers



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involved in DemoCIS are also members of the "Data Analytics and AI" and "Digital Sovereignty" thematic communities, which bring together over 200 teachers-researchers and researchers in data science and the social sciences.

Our consortium will involve **stakeholders** in its structuring actions:

- **Academic stakeholders:** the GIS Participation and Democracy, the European Alliance Eutopia, the Universities of Nantes, Avignon, Limoges and Paris 8, which can provide the project with targeted expertise, in particular in information and communications sciences, citizen mobilization and conflict management. International members of the consortium include the Universities of Amsterdam, Bonn, Montreal, Stanford, Princeton, University of Oregon, Johns Hopkins University, the Gruppo di Intervento e studio nel Campo dell'Educazione Linguistica. They will provide the consortium with the best research expertise and practices and will feed a comparative approach to the phenomena studied. Others include the *Maisons des Sciences de l'Homme* at partner sites and the MSH in Brussels and Liège, which will participate in the dissemination of research results.
- **Non-academic stakeholders** will play a full part in DemoCIS research work and will be involved in the construction of case studies, in the participative work of the four DemoCIS scientific Workpackages and will also participate in conducting experimental work:
  - o **Institutions and local authorities:** Conseil Economique, Social et Environnemental, Institut des Etudes et de la recherche sur le Droit et Justice, Défenseur des droits, Arcom, alongside local institutions, (regional councils, metropolitan institutions, town halls such as Métropole de Lille, Ville de Lille, Région Hauts de France, Métropole de Lyon) and education authorities (Rectorats);
  - o **Observatories and associations** working on democratic issues, including the Fédération des Centres Sociaux de France (FCSF), Observatoire de l'éthique publique, Mouvement associatif and Association Parlons démocratie, Mouvement ATD Quart Monde, Institut de la Concertation et de la Participation Citoyenne ICPC, Ligue des droits de l'homme, Amnesty International;
  - o **Companies**, such as the start-up Be my media and press and media companies.

## 2. Scientific component

### 2.1. State of the art and benchmark

**Recent research findings.** Democratic institutions have been seeking to innovate in response to the crisis of representative government, with varying degrees of success. Research has shown that the real and perceived gaps between elites and citizens are widening, as evidenced by the crisis in political vocations, the rise in abstention, electoral volatility (Blais, Daust, 2020) and a feeling of distrust towards decision-makers. Finally, the belief in the illegitimacy or ineffectiveness of national, local and European democratic institutions, perceived as insufficiently participatory, has been documented (Foa, Mounk, 2016). But the severity of the crisis in our democracies is today accompanied by a context of environmental, health, security and economic crises that are transforming decision-making processes (fragmentation, complexity, acceleration) and questioning the legitimacy of its players. Understanding the fragility of democracy necessarily requires a comprehensive approach, currently insufficiently developed, to all of the links and relationships between institutions and the actors who embody them, and citizens, both in terms of formal links (voting, political representation, etc.) and informal links (proximity between citizens and local governments, trust, etc.). **These are the three dimensions (conditions and renewal of deliberation, citizens' distrust of instituted powers, and institutional innovations) that Challenge 1 proposes to explore in a systemic way in response to the crisis democratic institutions.** As a counterpoint to the *top-down* perspective proposed by Challenge 1, the *bottom-up* perspective adopted in Challenge 2 aims to understand citizens' political practices and aspirations. For some researchers, the distrust of institutions can lead to increasing distance from the political system and can fuel support for authoritarian regimes or forms of expert government (Hibbing & Theiss-Morse, 1998; Caramani, 2017; Norris & Inglehart, 2019). For others, citizens,



especially the most precarious, aspire to take a greater part in making public choices by asserting the effectiveness of their rights or demanding new ones (Bayat, 2013; Scott, 1998; Spires, 2019). **Challenge 2 will mobilize intense interdisciplinary expertise on these issues to fuel action research aimed at experimenting with more inclusive democratic processes for marginalized citizens or those outside the mainstream.** The goal is to assess how shifts and changes in relationships that citizens on the margins, or outside institutional spaces, have with institutions contributes either to democratic deconsolidation or, conversely, to its revitalization. Alongside the vulnerabilities of democracies mentioned above, informational disorder – disinformation and misinformation – are considered major global risks (Wardle and Derakhshan, 2017) that threaten democratic cohesion, reinforce polarization, and weaken citizen participation (Clawson, 2021; Hunter, 2023). Research has illuminated how the media contribute to the polarization of public debate, how the web and socio-digital networks and information producers redefine modes of production and dissemination by modifying the “media regime” (Cesarini et al., 2024). It is critical to understand how current countermeasures are perceived and to assess their real impact on the spread of information disorder (Lewandowsky and Van Der Linden, 2021). **By combining approaches from semiology and discourse analysis with an integrated ecosystemic approach, Challenge 3 aims to shed light on these complex phenomena and thus strengthen democratic resilience.** The last major factor at the heart of the DemoCIS project addresses open and direct attacks on democracies (Brown, 2015; Lacroix, 2024): terrorist attacks targeting countries in the North, foreign powers conducting hybrid operations of digital influence and interference to influence electoral processes, the return of war to Europe that is threatening its democratic stability... These processes have generated a range of responses from governments. Numerous international and European organizations have warned of the risks of “shrinking democratic space” and a shift towards “illiberal democracies” (Jaume & Hourquebie, 2019; Buyse, 2018). Because of its academic specialization, the field of democratic studies has not given a central place to taking these threats into account and has given even less attention to the responses provided by institutional and civil society stakeholders. **The dialectic articulation of these threats and the responses provided by institutions and society will be at the heart of Challenge 4.**

**Against this backdrop, DemoCIS intends to offer an innovative vision and contribution that takes into consideration recent advances in research.**

- First, by studying democratic vulnerabilities from the point of view of institutions, how they function, and the imprint left by those who represent and embody them, as well as by analyzing the lived experiences of citizens, particularly those on the margins.
- Second, by studying the major risks and formal attacks threatening the functioning and stability of democracies, through the issues of disinformation, the weakening of media, direct attacks by terrorists, foreign interference, and open conflict.
- By adopting complementary methodological approaches that combine large-scale quantitative surveys, modelling, historical analysis, participatory research, and fieldwork. On the scale of the project as a whole, the combination of these approaches alone will make it possible to build a global and detailed vision of democratic fragility, to understand long-term dynamics and the lived experiences of citizens, to grasp local realities and, ultimately, to formulate better-informed recommendations to strengthen democratic resilience and provide decision-makers with material that will enable them to develop policies whose acceptability and legitimacy will be strengthened.
- By proposing the construction of permanent tools for the study of democracies and the strengthening of their resilience (the Democracy Barometer, the International Observatory of



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Democratic Practices and the University Institute for the Analysis of Public Opinion (IUAOP)) at the service of academic communities, public decision-makers and society as a whole.

**Benchmark.** Leading institutions in this field include the **Universities of Cambridge, Stanford, Amsterdam and Montreal**. The **University of Cambridge** is developing programmes of excellence in the field of spatial inequalities and their effects on political polarization and on decision making. It is also home to the YouGov-Cambridge Centre and POLIS, research hubs on media trust, disinformation, and misinformation. The **University of Amsterdam** is the European leader in research on informational disorder, via the ICDS initiative and various projects such as "AI, Media and Democracy" (<https://www.uva-icds.net/ai-media-democracy/>). The **Université de Montréal**'s strengths include piloting a multi-disciplinary and multi-institutional Centre for the Study of Democratic Citizenship and running the Observatoire des profilages on the relationship between the police, civil liberties and the rule of law and digital threats. The **citizens' conventions deployed in various countries and the networks of stakeholders organized around them**, such as Participedia, the Stanford Deliberative Democracy Lab or the transnational program initiated by the European University Institute in Florence, provide concrete examples and resources on innovative deliberative mechanisms. DemoCIS will build on existing links with several of these universities (Stanford, Amsterdam, Montreal) that are supporting the project, to draw inspiration from these initiatives and coordinate a leading international network.

The DemoCIS consortium **stands out for its scientific excellence, disciplinary diversity** (Political Science, Law, History of Law, Education Science, Sociology, Geography, History, Economics, Linguistics, Philology, Philosophy, Literature, Management, Information and Communications Sciences) **and the complementary expertise and methodological approaches of the researchers and teacher-researchers brought together to participate in the project**. DemoCIS brings to bear research forces of considerable breadth and richness to enable the consortium to grasp the multiple facets of the democratic crisis and the responses that can be made to it both "from above" (institutions, media) and "from below" (citizens, associations, social networks, etc.), today and in the past. The strength of our consortium also lies in its **ability to focus on democratic phenomena at dif-**



ferent scales, from European institutions and national parliaments to working-class neighborhoods and rural areas. The DemoCIS consortium can boast of a high-profile thanks not only to the expertise of its researchers and teacher-researchers on international and national democratic issues, but also to a **strong territorial base** that is as close as possible to the experience of citizens and communities in everyday democracy. This enables the consortium to take a global approach to this issue rather than a piecemeal one. The other major strength of the DemoCIS project lies in its **unique expertise in participatory research and its leading role in the field (head of the GIS Démocratie et participation)**, enabling it to co-produce solutions with institutions and citizens.

### 2.3. Research questions, objectives and methods

**Scientific and societal ambitions.** Our ambition is to engage our interdisciplinary, national, and international research collective in an ongoing, reflexive dialogue with civil society and public, local, national and European actors, to provide responses to the **4 major challenges that make up the project's Scientific Workpackages**.

**Challenge 1 (WP1) - Responding to the institutional crisis through democratic innovation: decision-making, deliberation and the evolution of institutional public spaces. Over a 3-year period**, our aim will be to produce a diagnosis of citizen trust, of the democratic fragilities of institutions and of the potential for progress in terms of decision-making methods, rebuilding citizen trust and moving towards more democratic and inclusive institutions. **1.1 Deliberation, rhetoric and decision-making in a crisis context.** We will examine how contexts of radical uncertainty - environmental, economic, health and security crises - reshape institutions, impact the deliberative nature of decision-making and impact how citizens react to it. We will produce **case studies and analyses of the processes and modes of decision-making**, the place of experts in them, and the **content of the discourses and narratives that feed them** (reports and analyses produced by national and European executive bodies, political parties, NGOs, parliamentary work, etc.). Various **disciplinary approaches** (philosophy, machine learning, political sociology, etc.) will feed into this work, as will the first part of the **International Observatory of Democratic Practices**, designed to map the factors that weaken and strengthen **deliberative democracy in a crisis context**. **1.2 - Ethics in public life and public trust.** On the citizens' side, the analysis of existing quantitative data and the results of qualitative case-studies will make it possible to build a national and international repertoire of the forms of citizen distrust of institutions and public policies. The local level will also be investigated, in order to question the impact of proximity on the perception of the effectiveness of public policies and the direct relations between citizens and their local representatives. The data thus produced will serve as the basis for the first phase of the **Democracy Barometer - political programs and citizen confidence** (quantitative and qualitative surveys), focusing on the factors that weaken and strengthen democracy. With respect to **political leaders and institutional actors**, we will use the tools of law, philosophy, history and political science to analyze the processes of professionalization, of the reinforcement of the ethics of public life and of the fight against corruption, and their limitations. These analyses will feed into the **International Observatory on Democratic Practices**, in its section devoted to the **ethics of public life**, and the production of training guides on best practices for good governance, in conjunction with players such as the ICPC (<https://i-cpc.org>). **1.3- Democratic innovation and institutional reform.** Based on the plurality of conceptions and criticisms of representative democracy, and drawing on processes for assessing how institutions function, we will analyze how various democratic innovations are possible at the local level, particularly in so-called "peripheral" territories, but also at the national, European, and international levels. We will examine the use of established forms of participatory democracy and the potential to transforming voting



methods to combat abstention (online or postal voting, etc.) and extending their use (to the workplace, university, school, etc.). The production of a map of institutional mechanisms for democratic inclusion will feed into the third section of *the International Observatory of Democratic Practices*, which will focus on **practices involving citizens in public decision making**. This observatory will be nourished by field experiments and scenarios simulating the impact of new forms of participatory democracy (serious democratic games...). **Research methods.** The production of *the International Observatory of Democratic Practices* will be supported by mapping existing institutional deliberative mechanisms, case studies and analyses of institutional and para-institutional productions. Action research will also be carried out, notably on the impact of new forms of participatory democracy. The construction of the **Democracy Barometer (Political Programs and Citizen Confidence section)** will be based on the **deployment of a panel survey** and will integrate a **qualitative survey** (interviews and focus groups with citizens) in France first and then abroad. We will also be rolling out the first theme of the **Citizens' convention**, "Institutional reform and democratic innovation". **Over the next 7 years**, we will formalize the first steps in the creation of an **Institut Universitaire d'Analyse de l'Opinion Publique (IUAOP)** focusing on Deliberative Democracy and Citizen Trust.

**Challenge 2 (WP2) - Rethinking the places and forms of the expression of citizenship: Every-day citizenship and new spaces for democracy. Over a 3-year period**, through 3 sub-challenges, our aim will be to assess how citizens experience their relationship with democracy and institutions, to make everyday citizen practices visible, and to analyze how citizens engage with or keep their distance from democratic innovations, by putting them into perspective with the history of mobilizations over time and in different societies. **2.1 Everyday relationships with representative democracy: backsliding and renewal.** In the wake of studies showing that individuals are increasingly willing to compromise with the core values of democracy - human rights, separation of powers, freedom of expression, equality before the law - we will investigate the trade-offs that citizens are prepared to make regarding the fundamentals of representative democracy, the ways in which other modes of "making democracy" (deliberative, direct, expert democracy, authoritarianism, etc.) are perceived and the extent to which they are perceived as compatible with liberal and representative democracy. The construction of this analysis will be based on the deployment of the second part of the **Democracy Barometer - Everyday Conceptions of Democracy** (quantitative and qualitative surveys). **2.2 The practices of everyday citizenship: between democratic fragility and renewal.** While a number of studies point to a tendency for everyday participation to become more fragile (restrictions on associative freedoms, resistance from those in power) our hypothesis is that the non-recognition of everyday citizenship and the knowledge it produces, in particular that of minority groups and/or those marginalized at various times (foreigners, women, people marginalized by gender, origin, poverty, etc.), contributes to democratic vulnerability. By setting up a series of **merging of knowledge** meetings involving teacher-researchers, professionals (e.g. city citizenship departments) and people with experience in citizenship "on the margins", our aim is to characterize the ways in which this everyday citizenship is expressed, and to study the day-to-day relationship of the ordinary citizen with the state and public services. Our long-term historical research will also enable an understanding of the citizenship, rooted in everyday life, of those who have been excluded from it. The **International Observatory of Democratic Practices** will thus include a fourth section devoted to **Past Citizen Initiatives** based on oral history interviews and analyses of digital archive sources.

**2.3 Citizen experimentation, new spaces for democratic deliberation.** New forms of civic engagement are leading to autonomous experimentation. Institutions are responding with deliberative public policies, which need to be analyzed in terms of how they are received by ordinary citizens. In



these experiments, participation biases and obstacles to the epistemic agency of ordinary citizens are clearly identified. The originality of this sub-challenge lies in tackling these issues through **action research** based on case studies in which the team has recognized expertise: in particular, health democracy, cultural mediation policies and the transmission of ideas and activist practices over time.

**Research methods.** The **quantitative** dimension of the *Democracy Barometer - Everyday Conceptions of Democracy* - will take the form of a panel survey and will also be based on a **qualitative survey** (interviews and focus groups with citizens). **Participatory research will be included in the Merging** of experiential, scientific, activist and professional **knowledge**. The *International Observatory of Democratic Practices* in its section devoted to *Past Citizen Initiatives* will be based on an **historical analysis** that will investigate archives and historical sources. **Biographical interviews and ethnographic** studies of everyday citizenship in various working-class areas will be carried out.

**Over a 7-year period**, our objectives will be to expand and sustain the *Democracy Barometer* and as indicated in Challenge 1, to integrate it into the *Institut Universitaire d'Analyse de l'Opinion Publique (IUAOP)*, which will gradually be set up. Challenge 2 will be mobilized to deploy the 3rd theme of the *Citizens' Convention: "Dematerialization, access to rights and public services"*.

**Challenge 3 – Acting against the polarization of societies and information disorder: information and knowledge transmission (WP3).** **Over a 3-year** period, our goal is to understand and model the mechanisms behind informational disorder systems, to develop analytical models for detecting systemic risks and to evaluate the effectiveness of existing solutions and countermeasures in curbing the spread of informational disorders and the associated risks of opinion and social group polarization. This will be carried out through three sub-challenges.

**3.1 Ecosystem dynamics of informational (dis)order.** The aim here is to understand and model the propagation of informational disorder which weakens the functioning of democracies and transforms public space. We will study the socio-political and cultural contexts of informational disorder and model them as a complex ecosystem. By taking into account its various dimensions (users and producers of information and social media, technologies, discourses, countermeasures, regulations, territorial dynamics), will be able to visualize the dynamics of informational disorder. This work (analysis of a corpus of content, quantitative and qualitative analysis of data from a variety of sources) will feed into the construction of a **Dynamic cartography of changes in the information ecosystem**. In addition, these findings will contribute to an analysis of the role of experts in public discourse and its evolution.

**3.2 Detecting systemic risks and developing indicators and tools for monitoring.** Our aim here is to develop approaches for identifying threats and vulnerabilities in information systems. **Specific, measurable indicators** for each ecosystem dimension will be developed, to **quantify the risks that each component** represents for the propagation of information disorder. This work will enable us to build **Analytical Models of critical ecosystem components** and their interactions that are likely to generate **systemic risks**.

**3.3 Countermeasures to informational disorder.** The assessment of the effectiveness of existing solutions and countermeasures designed to mitigate information disorder requires a multi-level approach, encompassing the analysis of the interaction between legal, technological, educational, professional, and cultural solutions. This will entail: i) conducting experiments to assess the efficacy of countermeasures (in particular, those implemented by platforms under the Digital Services Act (DSA) on modifying user media behavior); ii) analyzing the influence of professional and legal standards on stakeholders in information production; iii) studying the professional practices of these stakeholders in regulated environments; iv) analyzing the implementation and impact of institutional recommendations in the field of education, with a view to implementing pedagogical experiments. The findings of this research will inform the development of a **Framework Program** for Evaluation and Intervention of Countermeasures, **which will include a vademecum for**



**experts, best practices for professionals, and a train-the-trainer program** in collaboration with the Ecole de journalism de Lille and Instituts nationaux supérieurs du professorat et de l'éducation (INSPEs). Furthermore, awareness-raising actions for the general public will be conducted, including the Fresque de la désinformation. **Research methods used.** The **Dynamic Cartography of Changes in the Information Ecosystem** will be fed by a **corpus of content** representing the characteristics of information disorder and quantitative and qualitative analyses of data from a variety of sources. The construction of **analytical models of critical ecosystem components** and initial hypotheses for the prototyping of a **proactive threat and vulnerability monitoring tool** will be based on quantitative work and dynamic network modeling (Social Network Analysis (SNA) techniques), as well as content analysis, data mining and qualitative surveys. The development of the **Framework Program** for Evaluation and Intervention of Countermeasures will mobilize complementary approaches: participant observation in editorial offices and schools, laboratory and field experiments, participatory research, documentary analysis, ethnographic surveys, semi-structured interviews and empirical studies. **Over the next 7 years**, based on stabilized models and the prototype **Proactive Threat and Vulnerability Monitoring Tool**, we will move to a **predictive** approach to anticipate the evolution of potential risks and adapt solutions accordingly. We will then deploy the 4<sup>th</sup> theme of the **Citizens' Convention: "Democracy, (dis)information and freedom of expression"**.

**Challenge 4 - Strengthening threatened democracies: democratic conflicts and insecurities under the rule of law (WP4).** **Over a 3-year period**, through two sub-challenges, our aim will be to propose a comprehensive analytical framework on radicalization processes, political violence and hybrid attacks targeting democracies, as well as on new conflictualities affecting the rule of law and fundamental freedoms. **4.1 Democracies under attack: terrorism, political violence and hybrid threats.** This sub-challenge will deal with three threats: Salafi-jihadist terrorism; so-called "subversive" political violence; and hybrid threats, particularly in their cyber dimension. Analysis of the first two is limited by the difficulty of gaining access to the perpetrators of the attacks. To fill this gap, we will build **detailed databases** to conduct **sociological and historical analyses of radicalization processes and political violence**: i) profiles and life paths of jihadists imprisoned or having been imprisoned in France, ii) acts of so-called subversive violence committed by supremacists, vigilantes, conspiracy activists, etc., iii) life paths and radicalization processes of far-right activities. Historical research will also be carried out on state services and agencies responsible for combating foreign digital interference, and two surveys will be carried out, one on the criteria used by Viginum agents to decide on banning of digital content, and the other on cooperation between democratic states within the FAST network to combat cyberattacks. The aim of all this work will be to draw up an **inventory of the measures in place to combat hybrid attacks on democracies: national organizations, European defense and international cooperation**. An **international research network on radicalization and political violence** will also be set up, drawing on existing databases and partnerships (GERN, Université Libre de Bruxelles, etc.). **4.2 Weakened democratic defenses: rule of law and civil liberties.** The restriction of fundamental freedoms and the closure of democratic opportunities have led to an increase in social conflict. This sub-challenge will study these new forms of conflicts, their public regulation, and their impact on the rule of law and public freedoms, focusing on two areas: police-population relations on the one hand, and fundamental freedoms of political participation on the other. The first three years will be devoted to i) **producing a database and a cartography of restrictions on fundamental freedoms of political participation** at a European scale, based on data collected by partner observatories, ii) **conducting research** on the current ideas of the notion of "militant democracy" and in particular **prohibition and dissolution as**

procedures of democratic regulation, and iii) launch 2 action-research projects focusing on conflicts between local authorities and associations, police-population relations (which will be the subject of a citizens' convention in 2028). The results of this work will feed into *the International Observatory of Democratic Practices*, in its section dedicated to *New conflictualities and public regulations*. It will be supported by our consortium and its *Interdisciplinary Research Network on the Rule of Law and Fundamental Freedoms in France and Europe*, which draws on the Jean Monnet ProVALUE Chair, the GIS Euro-Lab and the GIS Democracy and Participation. Research methods. **Sociological and historical analyses of radicalization processes and political violence** will be based on judicial, administrative and prison archives. Two surveys (Viginum and the FAST network) and the research expertise of partners such as the CyberAlps Institute and UGA's Multidisciplinary Institute in Artificial Intelligence will be used to produce an *inventory of the measures in place to combat hybrid attacks against democracies*. The construction of the *International Observatory of New Conflicts and their Regulation* will be based on qualitative methods: archives, interviews, analysis of jurisprudence, etc. The second theme of the **Citizens' Convention, "Police-population relations"**, will be deployed. Over a 7-year period, we will further internationalize our research networks and deepen our research on democratic mediation mechanisms in certain areas (Lille, Grenoble, Lyon, the Ile-de-France region) for the regulation and management of local conflicts, in partnership with institutions and civil society.

## 2.4. Terms of action

The project is structured around the following six work packages (WPs). **Implementation of WP0 - Operational management of the project.** Operational management of the project is the responsibility of the DemoCIS project management and scientific coordination team, which is in charge of i) overall management of the project (Scientific Coordinator - Julien Talpin), ii) deployment of the project's actions (management team) and iii) coordination of the support resources



provided by each institution (monitoring of publications, setting up of European projects, support for the Science-Society link, support for public policies and transfer). The articulation of the project's deployment with the policy and support of each institution, particularly in terms of doctoral policy, will be ensured by the University of Lille's Vice-Presidency for Research in the Human and Social Sciences, in collaboration with the research vice-presidencies of the other institutions. **Deployment of WP 1 to WP4 - the project's scientific work packages.** Each work package is steered by a pair of scientific coordinators responsible for i) scientific leadership within the work package in an interdisciplinary and interinstitutional context, ii) ensuring that the projects carried out under the work package's sub-challenges are properly coordinated, and iii) overall coordination and monitoring of the deployment of actions in support of public policies and the transfer of knowledge to society. Each sub-challenge is supported by a pair of scientific leads in charge of deploying and steering DemoCIS



research projects, which benefit from internal resources. The DemoCIS project will not launch calls for projects: the first structuring projects have already been identified for the first 3 years (see Section 5.3 "3-year action plan"). The DemoCIS scientific program will be evaluated and updated at mid-term.

**Implementation of WP 5 - Transverse actions.** Action 1 - Support for public policies. This action will support the implementation of the **Citizens' Convention for Democracy**. After a first year of methodological preparation, the drafting of a *Methodological guide for inclusive citizens' conventions* and the development of an inclusive digital tool enabling the use of the hybrid format, the Citizens' Convention will successively address 4 democratic issues over the duration of the project (18 months per issue), articulated with the research projects developed in the challenges and carried out by an establishment on whose site the convention will take place: 1) Institutional reforms and democratic innovations (Université de Lille), 2) Police-population relations (CYU/IEP Saint Germain en Laye), 3) Dematerialization, access to rights and public services (Université Grenoble Alpes), 4) Democracy, (dis)information and freedom of expression (Université de Lille). Action 1 will also support the **coordination of the promotion and dissemination of DemoCIS expertise** and give rise to a harmonized policy for the production and **dissemination of policy briefs, policy papers, white papers, etc.** in formats adapted to the target audience.

Action 2 – DemoCIS Platform & science-society link, coordinated by the Université de Lille, will focus on the creation of the **DemoCIS living platform for democracy**, ensuring the dissemination of the project's various outputs: data and research results, expertise produced, video content, podcasts, MOOCs, etc. This action will further provide logistical and financial support for the deployment of a **DemoCIS education program**.

Action 3 - Technological development and support, co-managed by Inria and the University of Lille, will coordinate responses to the needs for **technological development and support** (1 dedicated FTE developer) of the project's 4 challenges (e.g. production of the Democracy Barometer, the platform for monitoring threats and flaws linked to the spread of informational disorders) and the **creation of cross-functional support tools** (DemoCIS platform, inclusive digital tool for the Citizens' Convention).

Action 4 - Data management, co-managed by CNRS and the University of Lille (1 dedicated FTE), will be responsible for creating a data management plan and implementing it in line with FAIR principles. It will draw on the Huma-num IR\* and PROGEDO IR\*s, as well as on consortium members' *University Data Platforms* and their dedicated tools and services.

Action 5 - Development of the national and international DemoCIS network, co-sponsored by CNRS and the University of Lille, will coordinate the organization of **recurring trips to stakeholders and key scientific events** (DecmoCIS Symposium), and the structuring and extension of the DemoCIS network, drawing on the many national stakeholders (Universities of Nantes, Paris 8 ; Limoges, Avignon, GIS Démocratie et participation, Maisons des Sciences de l'Homme et de la Société) and international stakeholders in the project, as well as CNRS units and networks abroad.

## 2.5. Production types

**Types of research products envisaged throughout the project.** DemoCIS research products will take a variety of forms. **Productions that enable us to take stock of and monitor democratic realities, fragilities and strengths**, in particular through the creation of cartographies (national cartography of institutional mechanisms for democratic inclusion (challenge 1); dynamic cartography of changes in the information ecosystem (challenge 3); mapping of restrictions on the fundamental freedoms of political participation (challenge 4)), databases (databases on past citizen practices (challenge 2), on the processes of radicalization and political violence (challenge 4)), a Democracy Barometer, fed by qualitative and quantitative studies, which will give rise to the Democracy Barometer Estates (challenges 1 and 2), a platform for observing and analyzing the dynamics of information



disorder (challenge 3). **Products that directly support public policies, public decisions and best practices:** the Citizens' Convention (which will mobilize the services of Huma-num IR\* for automatic transcription and hot storage, as well as collaborate with Inria for *topic modeling*), guide and charter (guide on inclusion in democracy in connection with the Citizens' Convention on inclusive democracy (challenge 2), methodological guide for inclusive citizens' conventions, training/guidance for civil society stakeholders to better defend fundamental rights (challenge 4)), reports, white papers, policy briefs (white paper on the dynamics of interaction within the information ecosystem (challenge 3)), democratic mediation systems to regulate local conflicts. **Policy for disseminating research productions and other work carried out as part of the project, in France and worldwide.** The dissemination will be organized through the DemoCIS platform, national and international symposia and the two international DemoCIS symposia to be held over the next 2-3 years and 6-7 years. The consortium will draw up periodic reports and produce policy briefs, guides and ethical charters for decision makers and develop awareness-raising initiatives for the public and targeted at specific audiences. **Open science initiatives.** A data management plan, in line with FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable) principles, will be implemented under the responsibility of the Operational Steering Committee (including a dedicated data management engineer), in liaison with the PROGEDO IR\*'s and the Huma-Num IR\*, ULille and partner university data platforms, the LORD workshop (Lille Open Research Data) and data management tools deployed by the sponsor and partners (Lillodata, the Research Data Gouv space dedicated to research data at the Université de Lille ). Project publications will be open access via a HAL DemoCIS collection.

### 3. Societal component

#### 3.1. Benchmark

The DemoCIS project has drawn on best practices to guide the design of its public policy support, dissemination and transfer activities, in particular those implemented by the Universities of Stanford, Montréal, Amsterdam, and Cambridge.

- **Collaboration with public decision-makers:** the Amsterdam Institute for Social Science Research (AISSR) works with local governments, such as the City of Amsterdam, to propose policies for inclusion and citizen participation.
- **Accessibility of research outputs:** Cambridge University's Centre for the Future of Democracy produces reports on critical issues such as the rise of populism and the loss of confidence in democratic institutions. These reports are distributed to policymakers and NGOs and are regularly cited in the international media.
- **The valorization of research, through training programs for public decision-makers.** In particular, the Stanford Cyber Policy Center offers training and workshops for policymakers, aimed at providing them with the tools they need to understand and combat digital threats such as disinformation and electoral interference.
- **Actions ensuring the Science-Society link** - Action research and citizen participation: Amsterdam Institute for Social Science Research (AISSR) is renowned for its participatory research projects, in which teacher-researchers work directly with citizens, NGOs and local authorities to co-construct solutions to democratic challenges. For example, research on participatory democracy in the Netherlands directly involves citizens in the research process.

**DemosCIS' ambition is to propose systems inspired by these best practices, fed by the results of the project research, in support of public policy and citizen involvement.**



### 3.2. Support for public policy and decision-making

Against the backdrop of the democratic crisis described above, DemoCIS's primary objective is to facilitate a more nuanced understanding of democratic fragility and the potential avenues for its re-consolidation through institutional innovation and reform. Our endeavor is to cultivate and evolve the conceptual frameworks and operational practices of decision-makers, encompassing elected representatives, institutional actors, and socio-economic stakeholders. Furthermore, we seek to bolster their actions by equipping them with the necessary tools and levers for adapting public policies and fostering active and inclusive citizenship. First and foremost, the **Citizens' Convention** will place citizens' voices at the heart of the DemoCIS project and draw on the research developed within the challenges to add to **the political agenda the changes required for better democratic governance** around the four key issues that will punctuate it. The debates and productions of the Citizens' Convention (policy papers, guides, topic modeling, etc.) will be used and disseminated to institutions and public stakeholders, to propose the necessary institutional and structural reforms, guide public policies and encourage the adoption of best practices. **Action-research** projects will be developed throughout the project, drawing on numerous institutional and associative partnerships (Ministries of Justice and the Interior, Défenseur des droits, Ville et Banlieue association, FFSU, CESE, ATD Quart Monde, FCSF, etc.): 1/ **action-research on Everyday Citizenship in working-class environments**, in collaboration with the University of Montréal; 2/ **action-research on the management of democratic conflicts**, to analyze the relationship of political staff to criticism, counter-power and citizen mobilization, **conducted with volunteer local authorities** linked to partner establishments located in Lille, Grenoble, Saint-Germain-en-Laye, Lyon, Limoges, Nantes and Saint-Denis; 3/ **action-research on police-population relations**. This will be informed by the Citizens' Convention on this issue (to be held in 2028), the results of which will then be applied and tested with the project's partner communities. These action-research projects will also feed into **training modules and workshops** for elected representatives and public officials. Support for public policies and decision-makers will also involve the development of the **DemoCIS researcher-expert program**. The expertise of the researchers and teacher-researchers involved in the project will be showcased on the DemoCIS platform through the creation of a directory of experts and an online solicitation system. Specific action will be taken to develop the skills of DemoCIS doctoral students as researcher-advisors through doctoral student-advisor training and mentoring, drawing on the **Consolid network** (a team of doctoral student-advisors at the University of Lille), which will gradually be deployed on partner sites. A **policy of expert communication of research results to institutional and media players** will also be implemented to ensure that the **research produced feeds into public and institutional debate**. The research results will be disseminated using media tailored to the target audience (reports, guides, policy papers, etc.), and will focus in particular on the project's central findings: The **governance** of DemoCIS, and the **Advisory Board** in particular, **including** representatives from public institutions, associations and civil society, will provide a forum for ongoing dialogue between the project's academic community and the public sphere, enabling the research to address the priorities of decision makers and, in turn, guide public policy support.

### 3.3. Transfer, dissemination and exploitation to society

Through its policy of transfer, dissemination, and valorization, DemoCIS aims to **make the knowledge produced accessible** to various target audiences: citizens, institutional stakeholders at local, national and European levels, associations and the media, with the aim of reducing the gap between citizens and decision makers. First and foremost, the aim is **to improve citizens' sense of political competence** by disseminating and promoting the knowledge gained from citizens' life



experience, made visible through participatory research and Citizens' Conventions, which should also be promoted to institutional players. We will also need to **share the diagnoses of democratic fragilities and insecurities**, and the **levers identified by the project to respond to them**, in collaboration with the European Alliance Eutopia, a stakeholder in the project, which contributes to the construction of the European educational space, with an interest in the question of democracy and public space. **To this end, the DemoCIS living platform for democracy** will play a key role in ensuring open access to the project's data and products. A range of media will be developed to provide easy access to research results for a variety of audiences. **Podcasts, videos, and virtual exhibitions** will be designed and distributed (on target themes: "Making the invisible visible", "Citizen experiments", etc., and around the Democracy Barometer). In addition, **training systems and tools** will be designed i) **for the public** (development of MOOCs, video capsules based on research findings, Fresque de la désinformation, etc.), ii) **for trainers, teacher-researcher, and students**, based on a partnership with the rectorats of consortium member sites, the INSPEs (Instituts national supérieur du professorat et de l'éducation) and those involved in training trainers. **Workshops, forums and exhibitions** will be organized to enable citizens to take ownership of the results of the research carried out. For example, a **traveling exhibition** will be proposed (dedicated programming for the 2027/2028 season **of the Xpérience**, a mediation tool enabling visitors to discover **research in the making**). It will then be displayed at the partners' sites via their Maison des sciences de l'Homme (MSH) and may also be taken up at the MSHs in Brussels, Liège and the Maison française in Oxford. The **MSH network** could also be mobilized to organize a **concerted scientific mediation action**, inspired by the **Printemps des SHS** organized each year by the Maison européenne des sciences de l'homme et de la société de Lille (the 13<sup>th</sup> edition in Spring 2022 was dedicated to Democracy). DemoCIS research will also be showcased on the "**Grande enquête**" television program, with a **special edition** devoted to it, broadcast on the "**Esprit sorcier TV**" channel, co-produced by the University of Lille as part of the "Science avec et pour la Société" (SAPS) label. Collaboration with **the Ecole Supérieure de Journalisme de Lille** and its **media network** will also ensure that DemoCIS research is relayed to the public. A partnership with **The Conversation**, an independent online media platform, will also enable the project's academic community to regularly publish scientific mediation articles to share the progress of the research carried out. DemoCIS's contribution to the rebuilding of democracy will also involve **raising awareness among elected representatives and public and institutional players** of the conditions required to restore public trust. **Tailor-made continuing education modules** will be developed, with the support of the facilities, skills, and internal resources of the consortium's member institutions, including the Exist program (*Executive Program in Innovation and Social Transitions*) of the Université de Lille. Training initiatives will be designed in conjunction with local authorities, within the framework of training agreements between the authorities and the university. These training courses, developed in partnership with the Centre national de la fonction publique territoriale (CNFPT), will focus on the right to participation for territorial executives, and on the management of democratic conflicts.

## 4. Signature of the institution

### 4.1. Support for the project

In line with the dynamic development of HSS within the institution, and in view of the central place occupied by the theme of democracy in its scientific strategy, the University of Lille will provide significant and diversified support for the deployment of DemoCIS:

- **Thesis funding and international development:** the University of Lille will contribute directly to the pool of young researchers by funding 3 theses from the SFRI GRAEL project, aimed at training



through research in the university's areas of excellence. In terms of international development, the university will assign two FTEs to the project as part of the ASDESR-Lille team dedicated to **setting up European projects** in HSS (France 2030 ASDESR project) and will mobilize its guest speaker funding scheme as well as its MobLilEx scholarship scheme to support the mobility of post-docs.

- **Setting up a reinforced project management environment:** the project environment will be integrated into the institutions' Transversal Project Engineering and Management Department (DTIMP - SAIC) to support its **administrative and financial management**.

- **Strengthening the resources for governance and for measuring the impact of HSS research:** the university will mobilize an FTE in charge of **monitoring publications and research productions, and of tracking indicators** linked to the project. This project will provide an opportunity to initiate in-depth work between partners to simplify the collection, storage and access to HSS research data, and to **develop reliable indicators** by cross-fertilizing experiences with monitoring and analysis tools currently being developed within some of the consortium's institutions (Lillanalytics-Université de Lille; BiblioRef-Université de Lyon 3): tracking research projects, scientific production dashboards, exhaustive data on mobility, post-docs...

- **Acceleration of actions dedicated to supporting public policies and the science-society link:** The project's efforts to promote dialogue between science and society will be boosted by the mobilization of its "Science with and for society" label (co-production of a biannual "Esprit sorcier TV" event dedicated to scientific mediation, organized with the Ombelliscience association, and showcasing research results with Xpérience). In terms of support for decision makers, one FTE from the ExIST program - Executive Program in Innovation and Social Transitions - will be mobilized to accelerate the development of the DemoCIS continuing education offer for public decision makers;

- **Supporting the open science project:** in line with the University of Lille's ambitious policy of opening up research, in 2018 the University created an open institutional archive, LilloOA (linked to the national HAL archive), carried out a number of precursory actions in the field of research data management. This support will involve the University of Lille's Service commun de la documentation and will focus on the development and implementation of a data management plan and the dissemination of open-access research products in accordance with FAIR principles.

#### 4.2. Transformative nature of the project for the lead institution

The **DemoCIS program aims to accelerate the structuring of HSS within the University of Lille, particularly on the theme of Democracy**, which already accounts for a significant proportion of the institution's HSS scientific output. This expected structuring primarily concerns the **reinforcement of training through research on democracy and the university's doctoral policy**. DemoCIS will involve several doctoral students in its research projects (financed via grants awarded to the project and 3 thesis grants awarded by the university, in addition to the theses currently underway on this theme), with a strong commitment to internationalizing the career paths of these doctoral students and training them to become experts, in conjunction with *Consolid*. DemoCIS's Lille-based teacher-researchers and researchers will also be mobilized as part of the graduate research training programs of the SFRI GRAEL project of excellence to train master's students. The "Changing Cultures, Societies and Practices" Graduate Program will also provide a pool of high-quality PhD candidates, trained in the best practices of education through research. DemoCIS will also accelerate the **creation of an Interdisciplinary Institute on Democracy and Citizenship**, in line with the ongoing development of the university's *Changing Cultures, Societies and Practices Hub*, and the momentum for the creation of interdisciplinary institutes on the site. This institute will combine research activities, open to the university's ecosystem of national and international academic partners strengthened through DemoCIS, with training through research and transfer.



### 4.3. Role of partners and stakeholders in the project strategy

The strategy underpinning the DemoCIS project is shared by all the members of the consortium, who are research-intensive institutions in the field of social sciences and humanities who place the issue of Democracy at the heart of their strategy. DemoCIS partners will be involved in the support and deployment of its scientific activities, through the steering of WPs and sub-WPs, the co-sponsorship of actions and the deployment of actions of WP5 (transversal actions), the contribution of approximately 10 thesis funding. The members of the consortium will also mobilize their services dedicated to linking science and society (labels SAPS), developing European projects, continuing education and research data development and management.

## 5. Implementation

### 5.1. Trajectory

The first year of the project will be dedicated to setting up the operational means to manage the project: recruitment of DemoCIS personnel (see financing plan) and installation of the governance. From years 1 to 3, we will i) deploy research projects already identified and ready to be implemented for each challenge, with inter-institutional and interdisciplinary research teams already established, ii) deploy the project's transverse actions and the first two themes of the Citizen's Convention, iii) Start building DemoCIS major results related to scientific workpackages and to transverse actions (see 3-year action plan).

A mid-term evaluation of the project will be carried out at the beginning of year 4 with the support of the Consultative Steering Committee, which will make recommendations for the second period of the project.

From year 4 to 7, we will continue to build on the major project results and develop the last two themes of the Citizen's Convention. This second period of the project will also be dedicated to intensively work around dissemination and valorization of the research results obtained in Phase 1 and implementing continuing education and actions for public actors and elected representatives.

To monitor and evaluate the implementation of the project, we will use the following performance indicators (see Appendix 8 for a complete vision of our target values for our performance indicators): i) Enlarge our scientific community by 10% and increase scientific publications by 15% for each measurement reference date, ii) Build up major projects: European and ERC projects. We are aiming for 1 ERC in 2027 and 2 in 2032, with submissions balanced between individual ERC applications and synergy ERC applications, iii) Increase the number of PhD students whose thesis focuses on our themes: 245 in 2027 and 270 in 2032 and iv) Increase the number of tools and actions dedicated to the valorization of qualitative and quantitative data (16 in 2027 and 25 in 2032), actions for public policy support (60 in 2027 and 120 in 2032).


### 5.2. Governance, steering and management

The Steering Committee, comprising a representative of each partner, the project's scientific coordinator and the project manager, will decide on the project's strategic, scientific, and budgetary orientations. It is the body that validates changes in the project's budget allocation, particularly those arising from the mid-term update of the scientific program. Steering Committee decisions are taken by consensus, failing which a vote is taken with one vote per partner institution. An annual meeting is extended to all stakeholders to monitor the project's implementation and progress. The Scientific Board is made up of the coordinators of the project's scientific work packages and the coordinators



of the transverse actions. Chaired by the project's scientific coordinator, this committee oversees, with the support of the Project Manager, the deployment of the scientific project and cross-functional actions in liaison with the academic communities of the consortium members and stakeholders.

The **Consultative Steering Committee** is made up of equal numbers of international academics and representatives of public institutions, associations and civil society. It is informed of the project's progress and results by the coordinators of each WP, whom it can interview. It also questions the teacher-researchers on democratic issues and makes recommendations on the project's scientific orientations (including a formal mid-term exercise to update the scientific strategy). The **Management Board** is made up of the scientific coordinator, the project manager and representatives of the support units for the various cross-functional actions (DemoCIS staff and partner personnel in charge of setting up EU funding and deploying Science-Society and transfer actions). It is responsible for implementing and monitoring the project's impact, by collecting and consolidating data for annual reviews and mid-term and final project evaluations.



### 5.3. 3-year action plan

Our key actions over the next three years will focus on the deployment of Project Management (WP0), Scientific Work Packages (WP1 to 4) and Transverse Actions (WP5).

<b>WP0:</b> Installation of the Project Management Team and of DemoCIS governance. Setting up of DemoCIS monitoring tools and evaluation process. <b>Major deliverables:</b> Regular Meetings of the governance bodies, associated reports. Annual monitoring report of DemoCIS actions implementation and performance indicators. Preparation of DemoCIS mid-term evaluation.
<b>WP1:</b> Deployment of resources (thesis, research engineers and post-docs, missions, etc.) and research networks. Research activities: case studies and analyses, panel and qualitative surveys. <b>Major deliverables:</b> International Observatory of Democratic Practices, Democracy Barometer (political programs and citizen confidence).
<b>WP2:</b> Deployment of resources (thesis, engineers and post-docs, missions, etc.) and research networks. Research activities: panel and qualitative surveys, historical analysis, cross-fertilization meetings, ethnographic studies. <b>Major deliverables:</b> Democracy Barometer (Ordinary Conceptions of Democracy), International Observatory of Democratic Practices on Past Citizen Initiatives
<b>WP3:</b> Deployment of resources (thesis, research engineers and post-docs, missions, etc.) and research networks. Research activities: analysis of a corpus of content, quantitative and qualitative analyses of data, creation of analytical models, participant observation, laboratory and field experiments. <b>Major deliverables:</b> dynamic cartography of changes in the information ecosystem, analytical models of critical ecosystem component.
<b>WP4:</b> Deployment of resources (thesis, research engineers and post-docs, missions, etc.) and research networks. Research activities: creation of databases, sociological and historical analyses, surveys, qualitative work. <b>Major deliverables:</b> Sociological and historical analyses of radicalization processes and political violence, international research network on radicalization and political violence, International Observatory of Democratic Practices - New conflictualities and public regulations.
<b>WP5:</b> Installation of functional work teams for each action, in conjunction with the Management Team. <b>Action 1:</b> methodological preparation, drafting of a methodological guide for inclusive citizens' conventions and the development of an inclusive digital tool enabling the use of the hybrid format.



Action 2: creation of DemoCIS living platform for democracy, dissemination of the project's various outputs, deployment of a DemoCIS education program. #### 5.4. Financing plan, sustainability

The total cost of the project is 77 612 889 €. The requested funding amounts to **9 118 821 € without management costs** (9 995 039€, including management costs). It breaks down as follows:

An allocation of part of the subsidy (excluding management costs) is planned between the partners, corresponding to research actions ready for deployment in the first phase of the project. It is as follows: University of Lille - 4 244 061 € for research and to deploy cross-functional activities, University of Lyon 3 – 851 800 €, UGA – 563 040 €, IEP Grenoble – 375 660 €, CYU Université-IEPG – 724 400 €, IMT – 722 600 €, CNRS – 500 000 €.

The remaining funding will be allocated by the consortium committee for the second period of the project, taking into account the mid-term evaluation and recommendations of the Consultative Steering Committee. The consortium will ensure the sustainability of the project after the end of the France 2030 grant by mobilizing various sources of funding: - internal resources (mainly continuing education), ANR grants, European projects, subsidies from local authorities.

Based on the joint study of several family archives, including correspondences, convention proceedings and press articles, it is a collective biography of 9 men who were all involved in women's rights activism but had different personal and activist trajectories as well as different marital arrangements. This research shows that men did contribute to the emergence of women's rights ideas in the United States, but they also proved to be “cumbersome allies,” sometimes drowning and suppressing women's voices while trying to control and narrow down the movement's agenda.

The essay focuses more specifically on 2 examples: the 2008 Democratic primaries; references to early feminists by contemporary "pro-life"—anti-abortion rights—groups. The metaphor was often used to describe the situation of (white) married women, who were deprived of their autonomy and property due to restrictive marriage legislation. In this chapter, I concur with the interpretation of most historians that this use was an appropriation of enslaved Black women's experiences. Through the study of the personal correspondences of 3 white feminist-abolitionist activists—Angelina Grimké, Abby Kelley Foster, and Lucy Stone—I also show that it was often used as a way to solve conflicts that emerged at the intersection of the personal, the intimate and the political, as the slavery metaphor allowed them to think about the consequences of marriage on their activism.</p>

Through concrete observation of the administrative processing of projects, the aim is to show how the participatory process becomes a tool for filtering and aligning feedback from residents with the objectives set by the town council in terms of local public action.

This work thus contributes to the reflection on how the algorithmic logic of engagement specific to the industrial rationality of social networks can foster the polarization of the online media landscape, and even affordances with reactionary or xenophobic ideologies. The interest of this work also lies in the diversity of methods employed (content analysis, ethnographic interviews) and in the interdisciplinarity of the approach (intersecting information and communication sciences with sociology and political science).

It puts the Court's role into perspective by combining law and politics. Far from evolving in a political vacuum, the CJEU is situated at the centre of a game of actors: it influences these actors as much as it is influenced by them. Three main contributions can be highlighted. Firstly, the book opens up the Court's black box to discuss its internal organisation from a variety of angles, including sociological ones. Secondly, it provides an analysis of the specific interactions that the Court has with each of the players in the European system (Council, Commission, Parliament, Member States, interest groups, etc.). Thirdly, it presents the Court's contribution to the constitutionalisation of EU law and, in a more original way, the way in which the Court contributes to the development and implementation of public policy. This is a key work, to which is linked a large number of my publications on the Court of Justice from a legal and political perspective (5 articles, 4 chapters, 18 papers, 2 invited lectures).

This article analyses the content and implementation of the Privacy Shield - an 'arrangement' allowing the transfer of data between Europe and the United States - from the point of view of EU law and through two main concepts: institutionalisation and judicialisation. It provides the conceptual tools for understanding the relationship between the EU and US legal orders, in an area where EU law is more protective than US law. The article shows that the degree of institutionalisation - defined as submission to stable rules, procedures and practices - is insufficient to prevent the Privacy Shield from being invalidated by the CJEU (understood as a form of 'negative judicialisation'). The remedies available to the US authorities remain inadequate, and the surveillance programmes remain disproportionate. This publication is the second in a series of three articles: it continues a reflection on Safe Harbour begun in an article published in European Papers and has been supplemented by a contribution to the Research Handbook on Transatlantic Relations taking into account the state of the law after the Schrems II ruling.

It is considered as a key article to understand the nature of soft law in the European Union. <i>This article is based on the assumption that there is a continuum running from non-legal positions to legally binding and judicially controlled commitments with, in between these two opposite types of norms, commitments that can be described as soft law. It aims at defining soft law in international relations in order to provide a mapping of EU law on the basis of the soft law / hard law divide. It helps categorize EU competences and public policies, and see how they fit with the distinction between two kinds of processes: legalization (transformation of non-legal norms into soft or hard law) and delegionalization (transformation of hard law norms into soft law and evolution from hard to soft law).</i>

European integration is associated with the idea of an 'ever closer Union', achieved in part through 'integration-through-crisis'. **Analytical Models of critical ecosystem components.** Key Actions (led by IMT): dynamic network modeling using Social Network Analysis (SNA) techniques and time series to detect interconnections and components critical to ecosystem resilience, content analysis and data mining to extract hidden patterns and trends in large datasets to identify risks and anomalies, using tools such as machine learning and decision trees, interactive dashboards for managing and analyzing risk indicators, qualitative surveys to collect and analyze data from information users, in order to assess the impact of identified risks, use of machine learning algorithms for proactive risk detection and ecosystem vulnerability identification, prototype of systemic risks and developing indicators and tools for monitoring. Deliverables: Specific and measurable indicators for each ecosystem component; Analytical models of critical ecosystem components and their interactions likely to generate systemic risks, detection of areas of dysfunction in the ecosystem; Initial assumptions for prototyping the systemic risks and developing indicators and tools for monitoring. It goes on to show how this approach enables a detailed study of the social determinants of voting in working-class areas. Finally, it shows that the localized nature of the system makes it possible to document the existence of neighborhood effects in ways other than through aggregated data.

Additionally, it offers a fresh perspective on the significant transformations in influence strategies amidst rising political authoritarianism and conflict, demonstrating how the challenges of



digital diplomacy and political influence are increasingly shaped by exponential privatization. This article opens a special issue on the theme of digital diplomacy under I. Lyubareva coordination.

This work thus contributes to the reflection on how the algorithmic logic of engagement specific to the industrial rationality of social networks can foster the polarization of the online media landscape, and even affordances with reactionary or xenophobic ideologies. The interest of this work also lies in the diversity of methods employed (content analysis, ethnographic interviews) and in the interdisciplinarity of the approach (intersecting information and communication sciences with sociology and political science).
